

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DIRECTOR'S NOTE Directing And A Child Shall Lead has been a horrific and heartbreaking journey of discovery for me. This is so much more than a story, much more than an account of what happened to young children of war during WWII. Located about 40 miles north of Prague in the Czech Republic, Terezín was built in 1780 as a military fortress and garrison town. When Nazi Germany occupied Czechoslovakia in 1941, the town was turned into a ghetto where Jews were gathered before they were sent further east to the extermination camps.

In less than four years, more than 12,000 children under the age of 15 passed through the Terezín Concentration Camp (also known by its German name of Theresienstadt) between the years 1942 and 1944. Of these, more than 95 percent perished during the Holocaust.

A group of dedicated teens made it their goal to care for the younger children, not just by taking care of the children's physical needs but by taking on the role of teacher. These young adults, not much older than their young peers, tried to insulate the children as much as possible from the depressing reality of ghetto life and fears of an uncertain future.

Despite their best efforts, it is clear from the children's drawings, diaries and secretly produced magazines that the children had an understanding of what was happening around them. Less than 100 children of Theresienstadt survived the death camps. For many of the children of Theresienstadt, the objects they created while there are the only things that remain of their lives. So, as we learn about Terezín, may we also reflect on the universality of the experiences and the part we each play in insuring that all humans are safe, accepted, and free. When adults declare war and commit inhuman acts against each other, it is the innocent children that pay the ultimate price.

BRUCE JACKLIN (Director) has been a certified adjudicator for OCTA (Ohio Community Theater Association) and AACT (American Association of Community Theater) for over 20 years. He has directed and acted in more than 170 productions in the last 35 years, including professional, summer stock, collegian and community productions. He has received numerous awards in acting and directing from OCTA, AACTfest, Columbus Theater Roundtable, and OTA festivals. Bruce was also in the film "Nietzsche Ate Here," which premiered in Washington, D.C. and was featured in the 2013 Montreal International Film Festival. He won Best Supporting Actor at the San Francisco Actor's Film Festival and in 2014 he received the Red Cross Education Hero Award. Bruce is a member of AFTRA/SAG (American Federation of Television and Radio Artists, Screen Actors Guild). Bruce is the artistic director for both MTVarts and The Alcove Theater productions.

MARY HARRIS (Production/Stage Manager) is a graduate of The Ohio State University where she earned her degree in Arts Management. While there, she directed and performed in shows with Off the Lake Productions, assistant stage managed with the OSU Theatre Department, and stage managed shows for community theatre groups, Little Theatre Off Broadway and Madlab in Columbus. Last season for MTVarts, she directed a show for the 2023 Night of One Acts, costumed and co-costumed the artsIQ productions of SEUSSICAL JR. and MATILDA JR., stage managed the Classics production of OUR TOWN, and performed onstage in SISTER ACT. Mary is honored to be a part of such a meaningful production.

CHRISTOPHER J. HARTMAN (Assistant Director) received his Bachelor of Fine Arts from Ohio Northern University with a major in Musical Theatre. Christopher is studying with the Great Lakes Michael Chekhov Consortium to receive certification in the Michael Chekhov Acting Technique. He was most recently seen onstage in MTVarts' production of Sister Act, which he also assistant directed. Christopher recently directed A Night of One-Acts 2024 alongside Mary Harris. He has also performed as Chris Keller in MTVarts' production of ALL MY SONS by Arthur Miller, George Gibbs in OUR TOWN by Thornton Wilder, Kapila/Devadatta in HAYAVADANA by Girish Karnad, Romeo in Shakespeare's ROMEO AND JULIET, Etches in TITANIC THE MUSICAL by Maury Yeston and Peter Stone, and he originated the role of Joe Rupp in Yianni Papadimos and Ben Chavez's musical, ELYSIUM: AN AMERICAN FABLE.

And A Child Shall Lead is the heroic and true story of children coming of age in Terezín, the "Jewish city" established by the Nazis near Prague as a way station before the death camps. In the face of unspeakable horror, these children use their determination and creativity to build lives filled with hope and beauty – playing, studying, making art, and writing an underground newspaper – all at the peril of being executed. Their real-life poems and stories are woven into a fast-paced drama, evoking the universality of children caught in the insanity of war.

From the beginning, the radically antisemitic Nazi German regime took steps to ruthlessly isolate, impoverish, and discriminate against the Jewish people in Germany. During World War II, this policy escalated to mass murder beyond Germany's borders.

The Nazis persecuted, brutalized, and murdered any group whom they saw as enemies or threats, building power by classifying groups of people as enemies or others. While the Nazis viewed the Jewish people as their primary enemy, they also persecuted people with disabilities, LGBTQ people, political dissenters, Jehova's Witnesses, and other factions of people.

Today, having lost almost everyone who witnessed the atrocities of the Holocaust firsthand, Holocaust education and awareness remains vital. By incorporating this education in our schools, this and future generations will come to understand how millions of people were impacted, and how together we can work to prevent anti-semitism, racism and all forms of intolerance.

A recent Pew Research Center study found that less than 40 percent of American teens have awareness that over six million Jews were killed in the Holocaust. Only one-third of teens know that Hitler was elected democratically. Teaching about the Holocaust inspires students to think critically about the past and consider their own roles and responsibilities in safekeeping a better society today.

We give our gratitude to the playwright, Michael Slade, for this sensitive, moving and impactful work and to MTVarts for staging it in our community.
