

Director's Notes



What a delight it has been to be surrounded by the fluid motion of the creative process. From the children and their excitement to this experienced cast, the enthusiastic collection of props and costumes to the construction and detailing of the set, lights and sound, this experience has been a foray of imagination, problem solving and creativity. I cannot say enough how humbled I am to work at this level with individuals who demonstrate commitment, responsibility and accountability. What you will see tonight is a culmination of abilities by many individuals. Creative people who willingly add their spark, their expertise and their flair to develop an experience of suspended reality for you, the audience. The "Arts" and all its complexities, when combined, create a powerful moment of grandeur when time stands still and you are transported away from the "now" to a different time and place.

And so, we do just that today, for you. You will see one of the most challenging theatrical roles for any child. The full characterization of another child, in a physically demanding manner, is a task not easily achieved. In addition, she is equally matched by her "teacher". Both actors maintain a consistent level of complexity and physical ability that indeed challenges their acting skills. This cast! What an outstanding collection of talent. They collectively work in a harmonious manner depicting the human condition of the culture, of the time, and of the place called Ivy Green.

Over the many years that I have directed shows, a phrase that I refer to often is, "Drama is tension. Tension is drama." You all will experience exactly what this means. For you will not only see it, you will indeed feel it!

Mr. Joseph Bell has been associated with various theatrical activities for most of his life. His focus on theater has primarily been associated with directing, set design and construction. He recently retired from Highland Local Schools as their Technical Arts/Graphic Design instructor, but continues as director of the theater program. In addition to the directing of this show and designing and constructing the set, his work has been related to The Velveteen Rabbit, The Wizard of Oz, Beauty and the Beast, The Glass Menagerie, I Never Saw another Butterfly, Shrek. He enjoys the creative process associated with the development of theatrical presentations. As a director, he enjoys watching the spark of excitement grow as young actors get the taste of a full-stage presentation. At the same time he enjoys working with students and youth in the design and construction phase of theater. When he is not working with theater activities, he and his wife develop and produce artistic opportunities through their business, Right Brain Productions. 
